The **Care Quality Commission (CQC)** checks if every health and social care service gives good care to people.

We checked this service on 11 February 2022

We visited this service to check how it was keeping people safe from infections that can make them ill.

What this service was doing well to keep people safe from infections



The service supported people to spend time at St Martin's and their home address.



People who were most likely to get very ill from an infection were supported in different ways.



People had support from staff who they knew well.



Staff found new ways of sharing messages with people and made a social media library for people to watch.

People were kept a safe distance from others when they needed to.



People arriving to use the service were supported to do this safely.



The service was using protective equipment, like gloves and face masks, in the right way.



The service was kept clean.

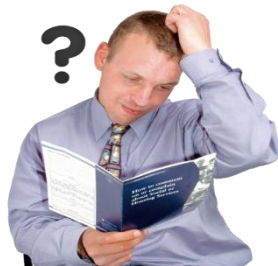


Staff were supported to help stop infections happening, with things like training.
