


Newsletter - Summer 2022

OPENING OF QUENTIN HOUSE—18 MAY 2022

The Rt. Rev. Declan Lang, Bishop of Clifton officially opened Quentin House on the 18th May. We have raised £1.5 million over the past 2 years.

The ST ROSES BIG BOUNCE campaign, fronted by Eddie 'the Eagle' Edwards, was launched in the summer of 2019 to start the fundraising for Quentin House – a specially-adapted residential home-from-home for our St Rose's children.

We are so grateful to everyone who has supported the campaign, especially our St Rose's Community – Our thanks also go to the <u>Summerfield Charitable Trust</u>, the <u>Pied Piper Appeal</u> who funded our Immersive Room, <u>Ardingly College</u>, <u>Barnwood Trust</u> our Trustees from the <u>English Dominican Congregation</u> and the Friends of St Rose's who all gave us significant amounts of money. There are so many others who have helped support the campaign and it wouldn't have happened without Gloucester based architects, Robert Limbrick and cost consultants, AFA Consultants.

Needless to say, our students won the hearts of everyone, including the workmen and even they supported the children's fundraising projects by buying chocolate smoothies and raffle tickets. During lockdown our students raised over £1000.




Cotswold wildlife park trip SR5


Calvert May 2022
